## FULL BOARD SERVICE

For full board clients, we provide a personal tent and food, which will be prepared by their climbing Sherpa. We provide UHF/VHF handheld radios on the mountain to maintain communications between ABC and high camps.

We provide a personal climbing Sherpa guide to help the clients reach the summit. The secret of success on Everest is a strong and experienced climbing Sherpa. No matter how good and experienced the climber is, it is a long slog. Personal climbing Sherpas will set up camps 1, 2, and 3. They will also carry food provisions, fuel and oxygen and guide and assist the client on the summit day.



## FULL BOARD SERVICE COST INCLUDES

- All arrival and departure transfer services to and from International and other necessary surface transport are as per the itinerary.
- A Satori Adventures representative assists at the international airport while arriving and departing.
- 4 Nights of five-star hotel accommodations in Kathmandu on a B/B basis.
- Chinese Government Royalty for Climbing Everest from North Normal Route
- Kathmandu-Lhasa- flight ticket for members
- Exit for all members from the Kerung border.
- All 'Nepali staff will enter and exit from Kerung Border
- 02 Night hotel accommodation in Lhasa and 02 nights in Shigatse and New Tingri (provided by CTMA and TMA; we do not have any choice or company innovation)
- Expedition Permit to climb Everest along Northeast ridge route;

- Total 5 Climbing Sherpa guides for three members + team leader.
- Mr Nepali Sherpa's guide will lead the trip from the Company site.
- Two extra guides will carry client-person equipment above the base camp.
- 7 Oxygen Bottles (28L) with masks and regulators for each client
- We provide Sherpa's tents, food for climbing, and insurance. Ice falls charges
- All tents for camps 1, 2, and 3 will be provided

- Gamow Bag will be available for expedition groups;
- Solar panels for light and battery chargers will be available for expedition members;

- Per person, 50kg baggage allowance during trekking-up carrying by porter or Yak and 40kg baggage allowance while returning from Base Camp after climbing the mountain.
- All wages, equipment, medical and accidental insurance for all involved staff.

- A guide for communication carries satellite phones and is available for members at the Cost of US\$ 4 per minute.
- Appropriate food is required for high altitudes, and all climbing crew are at base camp and above as required.

- Complete pre-departure information, flight ticket reconfirmation and visa extension procedure services (if necessary)

- Lunch and Dinner during your stay in Kathmandu (except farewell Dinner)

- Summit Bonus Minimum US\$ 1500.00 will be extra and not included in the Package cost. (Summit bonus should be paid once the client reaches camp three and above.
- US\$ 250.00 per member will be collected for tips from base camp staff, cooks, and assistant cooks.
- TMA or CTMA charges the environment fee.
- Fixed rope and Ice fall charge by CTMA or TMA for members and Sherpa guide.
- Set light, Wake talkies, & Filming permit (if special camera).
- Personal climbing gear;
- Nepal custom duty for import of expedition goods;
- Tips are monetary for base camp staff, collected at least US\$ 150.00 per person by a team leader, and handed over to our base camp manager for partition for all Kitchen-involved staff.

## EVEREST NORTHEAST ROUTE CAMPS:

### EVEREST BASE CAMP: 5,150M (16,700 FT)

Located on a gravel area 8 kilometres above Rongbuk Monastery, this is the end of the road. All vehicle-assisted evacuations start here; no helicopter evacuations are possible in Tibet. Everest Base Camp is a term used to describe two base camps on opposite sides of Mount Everest. The North Base Camp is in Tibet at 5,150 meters (16,900 ft), a latitude of 28°8'29"N and a longitude of 86°51'5"E. These camps are rudimentary campsites that mountain climbers use

during their ascent and descent. Climbers typically rest at base camp for several days for acclimatization to reduce the risks and severity of altitude sickness.

### INTERMEDIATE CAMP: 6,100M(20,300FT)– 6-7 HRS

The intermediate camp is used on the first trek to ABC during acclimatization. This is no more than a resting place for the night where a few tents are placed. Depending on the weather, this area can be lightly snow-covered or with no snow at all. Most climbers only stop here, ascending to the advanced camp from base camp. When descending, you can walk from ABC to BC in about 6 hours, and this camp will not be necessary.

### ADVANCED BASE CAMP: 6,485M(21,276 FT)– 6 HRS

Advanced Base Camp on the north side of Everest is one of the most advanced base camps in the world. This position makes it shorter and easier for climbers to reach camps I, II and III from the advanced base camp. Most teams will use ABC as their primary camp during the acclimatization period, but some climbers may need to descend to the intermediate camp to acclimate due to its altitude. ABC may or may not be snow-covered and offers stunning views of the North Col.

### CAMP I (NORTH COL): 7,000M (23,000FT)– 5- 6 HRS

Camp I is located just above the East Rongbuk Glacier. Most climbers will use crampons upon reaching the glacier. Within an hour of starting the ascent on the glacier, climbers will utilize a fixed line and cross ladders placed over deep crevasses. Using an ascender on the fixed rope in some areas will be very helpful. Rappelling or arm-wrapping techniques are used to descend the steeper areas of this section. Generally, climbers will spend 4-5 nights at Camp I during the expedition.

### CAMP II: 7,500 METERS (24,750 FEET) – 5 HOURS


The route to Camp II consists of a steep and snowy ridge that eventually turns to rock. High winds are sometimes a problem during this section, making it especially cold. The wind and air pressure are usually



higher on the north face versus the south side. Some expeditions use Camp II as their highest camp for acclimatization before beginning the summit push.

### CAMP III: 8,250M (27,390FT)– 6 HRS

Camp III is located along the steep area of the mountain that runs from 8,250 to 8,350 meters. There are a few small areas in this location to set up Camp III, and different expeditions will select various regions of the same general area. This area is steep, rocky, and exposed, and tents are perched on rock ledges, generally battered by the wind. Camp III on the north side is 350 meters higher than the South Col and more exposed. Most teams use this high camp as the last rest spot before the summit bid.



### SUMMIT: 8,850M (29,029FT) 9-13 HRS

Camp III to the summit is a long and hard day. Climbers use a fixed rope through the snow-filled gully, part of the Yellow Band. From the Yellow Band, the climbers change their oxygen cylinders and take a small ramp up to the northeast ridge. The route veers to the right of the high point, and most climbers rate it as steep and challenging. From Mushroom Rock, located at 8,600 meters, the route can be full of loose rock, adding to the difficulty. The next part of the climb is the Second Step, the climb's crux, as climbers use the Chinese ladder. Climbers ascend a 10-foot rock slab and climb the near-vertical 30-foot ladder. This section is very exposed, with a 9,000-foot vertical drop. Generally, it is more difficult to navigate on the descent since you cannot see your foot placement on the ladder rungs. Strong climbers take 9 to 10 hours to reach the summit and return to Camp III, while more moderate and less experienced climbers take 11 to 13 hours. Most climbers use 3-4 oxygen bottles during the summit push and another bottle between camps II and III.
